Interior	Tripping hazards, like rugs, removed or reinforced? Adequate lighting? Flush thresholds? Light switch at both ends of the hall?	Good	Needs Service
	Stairlift or elevator? Laundry on main floor? Master bedroom on main floor? Wider doorways? Open concept main floor layout? Home assistant device for emergencies?	Good	Needs Service
Bathroom	Walk-in shower? Non-slip tiled surface? Grab bars? Chest height for bath products? Hooks to hang brushes and loofahs? Telephone shower head? Anti-scalding devices?	Good	Needs Service
	Adequate natural and artificial lighting? Heated floors? Heated Bidet? Easy to mix water temperature with faucet? Vanity at a comfortable height to limit bending over?	Good	Needs Service
Kitchen	Walkways wide enough? Easy pull out shelves in lower cabinets? Lazy Susan? Enough counter space to prep food and a seated work zone?	Good	Needs Service
